1. Situation. This Wing Order enforces standardization and compliance of all medical elements under 2d Marine Aircraft Wing (MAW) with reference (a).

2. Cancellation. WgO 6120.9A.

3. Mission. To consolidate medical, occupational health and risk screening services, medical record review, preventive counseling, and risk communication under the umbrella of an annual assessment for all active duty members of 2d MAW.

3. Mission. To consolidate medical, occupational health and risk screening services, medical record review, preventive counseling, and risk communication under the umbrella of an annual assessment for all active duty members of 2d MAW.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. The Military Health System (MHS) has undergone a cultural transition to a system based on prevention. Research done by the United States Preventive Services Task Force produced strong evidence that using a variety of Clinical Preventive Services (CPS) can prevent causes of death and disability. CPS are primary and secondary prevention strategies employed in primary care settings. CPS includes:

(a) Screening for pre-clinical disease.

(b) Increasing the delivery of immunizations and chemoprophylaxis.

(c) Counseling to motivate health behavior change.

(d) Force Health Protection (FHP) and Medical Readiness have always been major objectives for deploying forces throughout the Fleet Marine Force. A cardinal principle of FHP is the transition from interventional health care to preventive health care. The Periodic Health Assessment (PHA) is the cornerstone of FHP. The PHA consolidates existing screening and preventive care with cardiovascular risk factors screening, medical readiness for deployment, immunization status, occupational risk and surveillance, gender specific health screening requirements, and health assessment and risk reduction counseling.

(2) Concept of Operations

(a) Annually, all active duty members of 2d MAW will receive assessment of their health status and individualized counseling in accordance with reference (a). References (b) through (p) outline current screening/examination requirements, including counseling supporting prevention and behavior risk

reduction. The PHA is considered a process, and may be accomplished in a single visit or may be spread over several encounters depending upon Group Aid Station/Branch Medical Clinic capabilities, scheduling, and operational tempo. Squadron medical units shall develop a Birth Month Recall database using Medical Readiness Reporting System or other acceptable means for identifying and scheduling members for their annual assessment until definitive PHA supporting software is introduced. This assessment does not replace or modify the full periodic physical examination or any specialty examination required by reference (c).

(b) Documentation of provided PHA services will be placed on the DD 2766, per reference (b). The current version for Tab 500 of the Automated Inspection Reporting System checklist for Commanding General's Inspection (CGI) cites the use of this form in the medical record. Completion and ongoing maintenance of the DD2766 is a requirement that will be verified during the CGI and other medical inspections/assist visits.

(c) Counseling is a joint effort between squadron medical units, base Semper Fit and Naval Hospital/Branch Medical Clinic Health Promotion departments. Close coordination of these elements will be made to ensure a seamless referral process.

b. Subordinate Element Missions

(1) Active duty members are responsible for keeping appointments for the PHA when scheduled.

(2) Unit commanding officers are responsible for ensuring all of their personnel complete the PHA when scheduled.

(3) Group Aid Stations/Branch Medical Clinics are responsible for conducting PHAs, including health record verification, medical readiness requirement updates, counseling or clinical referral as needed, and notifying members of scheduled appointments. Additional responsibilities include statistical tracking of the PHA program and providing the Wing Surgeon's Office and the unit commander's details of unit population health metrics or medical readiness status when requested.

c. Coordinating Instructions. The PHA must be conducted annually on all active duty service members through their respective Group Aid Station.
