MARINE AVIATION LOGISTICS SQUADRON 14 SECOND TO NONE

Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron 14 was activated on 1 March 1942 at Camp Kearney, California as part of Marine Aircraft Group 14 (MAG-14). From July 1942 until the end of hostilities with Japan, the squadron was assigned to the Pacific Theater and helped make possible air support for the naval battle of Guadalcanal and the landing at Bougainville. Throughout this period, pilots from the squadron were assigned transport missions providing logistics support to the Aircraft Group. The squadron moved to Okinawa in May 1945 and remained there as part of the occupation force.

In February 1946, the squadron returned to CONUS arriving at MCAS Oak Grove, New Bern, North Carolina. Reduced in strength during the demobilization period following the war, the squadron was used mainly for enlisted training and support of Atlantic Fleet Tactical Exercise in the Caribbean area.

During the Korean Conflict, the squadron lost many of its trained personnel to overseas duty. The squadron was redesignated Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron 14 on 15 June 1952 and less than a year later was relocated to Edenton, North Carolina. The squadron was later redesignated Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 14 (H&MS-14) during October 1958 and moved to MCAS Cherry Pont.

During the Vietnam Conflict, H&MS-14 furnished trained personnel to units deployed and received combat veterans who had completed their tour of duty. Since that time, the squadron continued to maintain personnel and equipment to support a variety of engine types, communications systems, and aircraft. H&MS-14 continued to provide support for the tactical squadrons of MAG-14 and administrative support for the supply and maintenance sections. In September 1988, H&MS was redesignated as Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron 14 (MALS-14).

On 27 August 1990, MALS-14 Forward (FWD) deployed to Southwest Asia (SWA) aboard the SS Wright in support of Marine Aircraft Group 40 4th Marine Expeditionary Brigade. In December 1990, MALS-14 FWD was transferred to the 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing in support of Operation Desert Shield/Storm. The support provided by MALS-14 contributed to the highest aircraft readiness rates for a Marine unit in SWA and Operation Desert Storm. Concluding the first combat deployment for the squadron since WWII, MALS-14 returned to Cherry Point in April 1991,

In August of 1991, MALS-14 was selected as the first winner of the Marine Corps Aviation Association's MALS of the Year Award. In June 1991, MALS-14 added another battle streamer to its colors with the Southwest Asia Service Medal. In February 1992, MALS-14 was awarded the Navy Unit Commendation for meritorious service. On 1 May 1993, the squadron completed reorganization by absorbing MALS-32 prior to its deactivation on 29 April 1993.

The Marines of MALS-14 continued to provide combat support for operations such as Operation Deny Flight in 1995, Operation Decisive Edge in 1996, Operation Northern Watch in 1997; and operations in Kosovo ending in July 1999. In January 2002, MALS-14 participated in Operation Enduring Freedom and in March 2003, Operation Iraqi Freedom. The squadron continues to provide impeccable support to MAG-14's AV-8B and KC-130 aircraft

Command Philosophy

My command philosophy serves as a point of reference for everything this squadron does, both operationally and in garrison; providing insight regarding what I hold as core values. Foremost, I strive to provide the Marines and Sailors of this squadron an opportunity to lead and operate in an environment that is conducive to both personal and professional development. I hold all personnel assigned to the squadron responsible, at all times, to the tenets of this guidance.

- 1. <u>Professionalism</u>. Be a professional at all times anything less is unacceptable. I define a professional as someone who commits to an organization that has 1) a unique body of knowledge; 2) has a code of ethics; and 3) has an enforcement mechanism in place to ensure compliance to its standards.
- 2. Accountability. Accountability is ownership Officers, SNCOs, NCOs and those in a leadership position are responsible for the accountability, education, training, welfare, employment, maintenance, and development of their personnel and equipment, both tactically and in garrison. There are no exceptions, exemptions, or exclusions from this basic concept. We take care of our own.
- 3. <u>Initiative</u>. Marines and Sailors must have an innate bias for action. Independent action and distributed operations are essential to the success of this squadron. Effective leaders trust their subordinates and that trust is a critical aspect of any relationship. Trust is built through effective communication of tasks, aggressive training, and by thrusting our junior leaders into challenging situations at every opportunity.
- 4. Operational Tempo. The high operational tempo we keep within MALS-14 provides unique challenges for our loved ones. Our families demonstrate great resiliency due in no small part to active and robust unit, personal, and family readiness programs. Family readiness is integral to combat readiness and requires that families are prepared at all times for deployment. Working together, we take care of our most valuable resources our Marines, Sailors, and their families "Mission First, Families Always."
- 5. <u>Respect</u>. Treat every Marine, Sailor, and civilian with dignity and decency. Showing genuine care and compassion for those we work with fosters a productive and fulfilling environment.

It is an honor and privilege to serve with all of you. We win together.

Housing Information

Family Housing: If you are married or a single parent and bringing a family to Cherry Point, the Housing Department can assist with finding on-station and off-station housing. The Housing Department is opened Monday through Friday (excluding holidays) from 0730-1600 and is located at Building 286.

On-Station Housing: On-station housing can be applied for with an advance application or in person. Advance Applications are placed on the inbound wait list 30 days prior to your Estimated Departure Date (EDD), as dated on your WEB orders. Your application can be referred to the Public Private Venture (PPV) up to thirty days prior to your EDD as long as all of your documentation has been received. Transient Housing: Cherry Point offers transient housing quarters for those personnel on PCS orders only on a space-available basis. PCS families can be accommodated up to 30 days. Rooms include two full-size beds, microwave, iron/ironing board, and refrigerator. Enlisted Marines/Sailors can contact the Transient Enlisting Quarters at 252-466-3060. Marine/Navy Officers can contact the Transient Officer Quarters at 252-466-5169. If transient quarters are unavailable, a full listing of hotels in the local area is available on request. Ensure you request a certificate of non-availability to be authorized to stay out in town.


Calendar of Events
